

## **Objectives of the study**


- To study the socioeconomic context of the desludging service providers

- Qualitative 20






## **Findings-Quantitative**


#### Number of trucks






#### Area of service delivery

How did they get into the business?


- Started as a allied business

# **Findings-Qualitative**

- Types of ownership-
  - Owns and operates
  - Owns and manages but doesn't operate
  - Intermediary
- Diverse background in terms of education and awareness





# **Findings-Qualitative contd..**

## Concerns

- Lack of disposal sites
  - Disposal over land
  - Disposal into water bodies
  - Difficult process to access disposal facility at STPs.
    - Charges
    - Paperwork







# **Findings-Qualitative contd..**

### Concerns contd..

- Business related issues
  - Pricing
  - Communication
    between service
    providers and endusers





# **Findings-Qualitative contd..**

## Concerns contd..

- Lack of dignity inspite of providing an essential service
- Lack of safe practices
- Lack of relevant training





## Recommendations

- Access to disposal points
- Bringing dignity to the profession
- Forum to strengthen communication with end-users and policy makers- "Desludging Service Providers' Association
- Inclusion of service providers' issues into the NFSSM policy primer
