A brief history of Natural Event's Origins, Achievements and Future Direction

Australia

- 2000 Developed permanent installation of raised composting toilets for 3000 person festival on own property
- 2003 Designed and manufactured a mobile, flat packing system for expansion into large scale temporary events
- 2003 Natural Event effects legislation change in Tasmania, for the acceptance of collection, storage, treatment and application to land of Composting Toilet material on scale.
- 2005 New Years Eve, Natural Event provides and services toilet facilities for 65,000 people, across 4 events and 3 states
- 2005 Victorian Environmental Protection Authority, recognises and permits Natural Events methods and system
- 2008 Delivery of toilet provision to over 150 festivals since 2003, from Tasmania to Far North Queensland
- 2010 Over 900 permanent installations of the Natural Event Toilet, System and Management Plan, across 5 camping festival sites from Tasmania to Far North Queensland

UK & Europe

- 2008 Expansion to UK & Europe
- 2010 Alignment / Partnership formed with Susan Design (Norway) to explore the links & synergies between the Festival Context and Development and Emergency Response Sanitation.
- 2011 Natural Event effects policy development for the storage, treatment and application to land of composting toilet material on a national level in England, through the recognition of its system and processes.

Haiti & USA

- 2010 Orientation visit to Haiti as consultant to Give Love, NGO tackling sanitation and housing issues after the devastating earthquake
- 2012 Maintained consultation with Give Love throughout, return visit to develop design and management proposal of sanitation system of a new 25,000 person housing development

- 2012 Reconnaissance tour of East Coast USA to build team and client base for expansion to USA in 2013

Cubicles in action

• Natural Event's toilet infrastructure is compact, flat packing and highly transportable

- It can be made ready for deployment on short notice.
- It is quick to erect and adaptable to irregular terrain
- It has infinite capacity, and can be serviced and managed without the use of electricity machinery or other infrastructure.

Natural Event can support immediate, short and medium term sanitation needs and facilitate the development of longerterm integrated community solutions.

Key factor – Carbon Source

-the addition of carbon provides a barrier to disease vectors, covers odour and makes toilets pleasant to use.

-primary or secondary industries producing woodchip / sawdust / organic matter need to be supported and brought into the loop.

-initial input of carbon supply is required to support self perpetuation of the production of carbon from the composted toilet material.
