



Case study Dar es Salaam 2022

Data estimated by BORDA

Sewer-born sanitation Coverage: 30 % WW generation: 40% On-site dry sanitation Coverage 40% WW generation: 20%

On-site wet sanitation Coverage: 30% WW generation: 40%

A. Supply







Appropriate regulation for effluent discharge!!!

COD 70 mg/l or phosphate 1 mg/l

Are not yet appropriate for developing countries and as long river are like this

What is needed:

- ✓ Phased effluent standards according to the discharged quantity and country specific socioeconomic growth
- ✓ Regulation to integrate DEWATS in urban planning
- ✓ Standardize and certify low-tech wastewater systems and <u>aim for a bigger impact</u>
- ✓ Build the capacity of local authorities in effective law enforcement

- ✓ Authorities who can approve and certify decentralized solutions and technologies
- ✓ Institutions for quality bench marking and control, and sector training
- ✓ Operator and supplier associations
