




2003 – 2010 - DEWATS-CBS / SANIMAS Implementations



2003 – 2010:

- 25 Province

- 172 Cities/Municipalities

- 514 Locations



2010 – 2014 - DEWATS-CBS large up-scaling in Indonesia



- **Sanitation Development Target Indonesia:** “Open-defecation free by the end of 2014”
- **Settlement Sanitation Development Acceleration Program (PPSP):**
 - Indonesia Government supporting investment in sanitation sector to implement 1000 DEWATS/per year in over 300 cities = 12.000 location
 - Serving 4+ million people
- Estimation: 6500 DEWATS-CBS in Indonesia by 2013

Challenge – Urgent need of a workable framework for long-term aftercare and financing for major maintenance to support the growing number of DEWATS plants and CBOs

The “AKSANSI Approach”: Interface between CBOs, DEWATS-Operator/ Service Provider and LGs as an “After-care service provider” for DEWATS projects

AKSANSI: Founded in 2006 and financially supported by BORDA and an umbrella organization on sanitation in Indonesia to support:

CBOs

- Service provision
- Operation and Maintenance (O&M)
- Health and Hygiene Education

Local Governments

- Cooperation and communication with sanitation stakeholders
- Monitoring of sanitation facilities

1. CBO Management

- Supporting CBO and operators in service provision and management
- Knowledge Management and transfer of Best Practices;
- Complaint mechanism for communities (e. g. Call Centre)
- Lobbying CBOs towards stakeholders and policy makers
- Training of operators and technical facilitators

2. Biogas Taskforce

- Biogas Taskforce to monitor, solve problems and rehabilitate biogas installation in the provinces Yogyakarta, Central Java, East Java, West Java and Banten
- Raise awareness in utilizing biogas and benefits of the alternative energy sources for Local Governments and CBOs (Biogas Movie)

3. Monitoring

- Monitoring of DEWATS plants build by BORDA Partner
- Data analysis, evaluation, clustering and visualization of findings
- Providing targeted information to CBOs and Local Governments for providing financial support to CBO
- Facilitating corrective action and rehabilitation for DEWATS plants

4. Cooperation with Local Governments/ authorities

- Initiating Multicity Seminar for 20 Local Governments interested to cooperate with AKSANSI under framework of legalized MoU
- Assisting Local Government with workshops and trainings
- Drafting MoU on Co-Management for Aksansi Branches in 4 cities

Finances:

- Limited funds (BORDA and some LGs) can not cover program activities and establish AKSANSI Branches all around Indonesia

Logistics:

- Limited budget results in limited monitoring activities
- Wide spread of CBS locations requires high traveling cost

Human Resources:

- Limited staff and internal Capacity Building needed
- Aksansi branches that use CBO resources need regular Capacity Building
