# Three (3) STAR Approach: Minimum Criteria

# Development of a scalable performance model within Yolanda affected DepEd divisions:

- Ownership: WASH in Schools is integrated under SBM by DepEd (Governance) with appropriate fund allocation
- Incentive: Quality of program implementation and O&M of WASH facilities are performance indicator for school heads
- 3. Rewards: Competitive performance ranking of districts using three start approach with at least two star level achievement
- Capacity Development: Strengthening of WinS M&E within DepEd targeting WINS Bottlenecks,
   Certification of Three Star Approach
