## SuSanA – Alianza de Saneamiento Sostenible


- SuSanA es una red informal de los que comparten una visión común sobre el saneamiento sostenible

- 77 % use of improved sanitation facilities







## The status quo – MDGs in urban areas


## SDG: A more comprehensive approach



## Goal 6. Ensure availability and sustainable management of water and sanitation for all

- **6.2** By 2030, achieve access to adequate and equitable sanitation and hygiene for all and end open defecation, paying special attention to the needs of women and girls and those in vulnerable situations
  - 6.2.1 Proportion of population using safely managed sanitation services, including a handwashing facility with soap and water
- **6.3** By 2030, improve water quality by reducing pollution, eliminating dumping and minimizing release of hazardous chemicals and materials, halving the proportion of untreated wastewater and substantially increasing recycling and safe reuse globally
  - 6.3.1 Proportion of wastewater safely treated
  - 6.3.2 Proportion of bodies of water with good ambient water quality


## **Urban sanitation in LA**









