Our impact



Benin's government reports that HLM participation was influential in raising political will and improved engagement with multiple partners.

By mid-2015, **Finland** reported they had already reached the one million people they committed to supporting with the provision of water and sanitation services at the 2014 HLM.

Afghanistan reports that lessons learned from other countries at SWA meetings were of critical value in developing national processes.



In **Paraguay,** SWA's influence is facilitating a change of paradigm, where government leads action, and encourages participation from citizens, aid agencies, NGOs, the private sector and local governments.
