The challenge – knowledge and skills for sustainable sanitation

- Professional roles: Workers, managers, experts, researchers, trainers
- Subjects: Technology, economics, business, social, agriculture, hygiene
- Tools: planning, financing, construction, operation & maintenance



It is not just about filling gaps

- Paradigm shift sustainable sanitation is not simply
 - Wastewater treatment
 - Building toilets
 - Hygiene education
- Sustainable sanitation is about
 - Building a socio-technical system that is sustained after the project is finished
- This requires a change of mindset
 - Among professionals
 - Among decisionmakers
 - Among people in general

- Bringing people together, learning from each other – learning by working in NETSSAF
- Workshops for university lecturers
- Development of strategies for academic capacity building

- With invited experts
- Aimed at university lecturers
- First step introducing concepts of sustainable sanitation, opening up for paradigm shift.



NETSSAF results: Bringing Sustainable sanitation into the University curriculum

- Lecturers can act locally:
 - Introducing sustainable sanitaiton to syllabus, within given curriculum
 - Students projects!
- Change at university level:
 - In French-speaking countries: Opportunity to introduce Sustainable sanitation programmes when universities are transformed to Bachelor-Master-Doctorate system

Research and development

- Focus on development:
 - Bring in research results from elsewhere
 - Adapt to local conditions
 - Create learning organisations
 - Put NETSSAF tools into practice

NETSSAF strategy: Training of trainers

- Local champions needed enthusiastic experts – knowledge sharing and growing
 - Bring in international knowledge, adopt and spread it locally
 - Send to international training courses
 - Engage in international networks
- Strengthen existing water and sanitation training institutions
- Make sanitation careers attractive!



NETSSAF strategy: Knowledge transfer

- Teaching materials
 - Translations needed from English to French
- Improve Internet access
 - Abundant information freely available

NETSSAF strategy: Need for demonstration sites!

- Seeing is believing
 - show how systems can work
- Place for hands-on training
- Place for discussion and development
