





WASH for Health

as a key element for global health and pandemic prevention

Version 2.0 - DRAFT

The Key Messages

- Recognizing WASH as a key requirement for health and increasing attention and investment targeted at the interlinkages of WASH for Health, through establishing financing mechanisms aimed at intersectoral collaboration.
- Incentivizing cross-sectoral working and a joint project planning to ensure the integration of WASH for Health in relevant strategies and programs with a particular focus on hotspots of disease transmission (healthcare facilities, schools, emergencies and humanitarian settings).
- Strengthen national and sub-national coordination between ministries responsible for health, finance and WASH and integrating WASH for Health into the scope of global Pandemic Preparedness plans and the implementation of country-led, costed national strategies.



The Approach / Bringing the WASH and Health Sector closer together offers important opportunities to better achieve not only SDG 3 and SDG 6. In a range of areas, like 1. Pandemic and Disease Control, 2. Health System Strengthening and 3. Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights, joint approaches and intersectoral collaboration are a pre-condition for achieving the goals. The One Health Framework provides a wider perspective and helps to bring together key action fields shared by both sectors as well as connecting them with the broader SDG arena and cross-cutting topics (e.g., gender, nutrition, climate).
